Mother Angeline's philosophy—"If you must fail, let it be on the side of kindness. Be kinder than kindness itself to the old people"—remains the foundation of the Carmelite mission. Though she passed away in 1984, her congregation has flourished, extending care and advocacy to thousands while continuing her mission of "The Difference is Love."

As the Sisters celebrate their past, they are also focused on the future. Recognizing the challenges posed by underutilized church properties and the evolving needs of society, the Carmelite System recently launched The Carith Foundation.

While its primary focus remains on elderly care, Carith aims to expand its reach into affordable housing, autism support, and broader health services.
